Dear Fathers and my dear brothers,

We have just begun a new year in our faith life and are living the journeyof Advent in preparation for the feast of Christmas. This is a significant time to be lived with great seriousness, as it helps us once again to renew ourselves and prepare a 'room' in our lives for welcoming the Saviour of the world.

There is a beautiful painting of Mary, mother of Jesus in a catholic church in Berlin. This particular art is done by a German soldier in the year 1942. It projects Mary carrying child Jesus in her arms. Under the image it is written: "Light - Life - Love". These three words converse obviously the message of Christmas.

At Christmas, God enters into the lives of humanity. God is not afraid to go into the depths of human need and poverty. He takes care of people's needs providing them light, life, and love.

Light: The word of God points out that, the true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world through the person of Jesus (Ref: John 1:9). Dietrich Bonhoeffer says: "With Christmas, the light of peace breaks into our world and ignites the eyes with the lights of joy." This thought indicates to Jesus and his mission as the Son of God. He gives people warmth, comfort, hope and peace. Jesus, the word made flesh, throws light into various problems of our life. He is the true light which lightens our life.

Life: During Advent we sing, "The Lord of glory comes...he brings salvation and glory". Man wants to live. He longs for a fulfilled life. At the birth of Jesus, the angel proclaimed; "For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord" (Luke 2:11). With the birth of Jesus a life in abundance becomes possible for us. Jesus says about himself: "I am the way and the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). In Jesus Christ we have an orientation for our way of life. He is the real way through which we make our heavenly journey.

Love: At the face of mischief and the strife of the world, God comes with his boundless love. He wants to convey that, he is there for us. He will take us by the hand and lead us in our life. Christmas is a love letter of God to humanity. God is love and that love has become flesh - in the person of Jesus Christ. Jesus reminds us that, "As the Father loved me, so I loved you. Remain in my love!" (John.15:9). He continues to remind that, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Mark 12:31).

One of the great theologians of our century, Karl Rahner, sums up the Christmas message as God's love to us: "When we say, it is Christmas, then we say God has his last, his profound and his most beautiful word in his incarnate Word of the World expressed, a word that cannot be undone, because this is his final act, because it is God himself in the World. This Word means, "I love you, you world and you man"

Light, life and love are the gifts of God on Christmas for us. I thank you all for the witness you give as Salettiner in your life and ministry. As you prepare to welcome Christ and give him a 'room' in your lives, I pray that, Christ may reign in your hearts and may you experience his Peace.

I send my sincere greetings and wish to each one of you. Have a blessed and peace-filled Christmas! I request your prayers for me and for the Provincial Administration as we perform our ministry of leadership in serving the Congregation.

My Vocation Journey

Bro. Jophin Thakkolkaran

I am hailing from St. John the Baptist Church Moonnumury, Diocese of Irinjalakuda, Thrissur. My father is Johnson and mother is Philomina. My sister Jophina is doing her degree studies. I was not known to religious vocations and from childhood dreamed to be a diocesan priest. I used to pray to God for me to be



a Diocesan priest, and finally joined in the Irinjalakuda diocesan seminary. However I needed to take a medical break for six months from the formation. This was God given opportunity for me to reflect more on my life and on my vocation.

I met with Fr. Jenson one day in the parish and he asked me on my willingness to join La Salette. The name 'La Salette' was not known to me and could not give a right answer to him at that time. I was fallen in to confusion and interceded through Blessed Mother for a right decision. Finally I realized my call in La Salette and joined with our community in June 2015. I completed three years of my minor seminary formation from La Salette Niketan, Mysore. At present doing my 2nd year Philosophy studies in La Salette Sadhan, Bangalore. When I look back to my life and my vocation journey, there was number of challenges, hardships and moments of failures. However in all these, I could witness the miraculous hands of our Lord and our Blessed Mother to lift me up.

Rev. Fr. Jacob Vettathu MS

When I am asked to write a few lines about my vocation, I am so happy to respond as I am joyfully thanking God for my Silver Jubilee of my Ordination to priesthood as well as 60 years of God's gift of life.

I was born on June 01, 1960 in the parish of Saint Mary's Church Arakulam, as the 4th child among 8 siblings. Both my parents had siblings as well as cousins who were priests and nuns;

my parish too had so many priests and nuns serving very actively in different parts of India and the world, and they used to come and share to us, catechism students, about their life and mission; my primary school studies done in the parish school staffed by many Sacred Heart Sisters; my own two elder sisters being Franciscan Nuns etc., nurtured God's small seed of vocation sprouting within me. The earliest I can remember is when my grade one teacher, a Sacred Heart Nun, had asked in the class who among us would like to become a priest, I showed my hand. And that desire continued throughout my school years. Even if my high school years were in a Government Public school, the only school in my area, it also occasioned to interact more with batchmates and teachers of other religions and to see the goodness of God manifested in them.

My father was very active in the Parish and School community. My own little way I too actively participated in the parish pious and missionary organizations like Sodality, Mission League etc. My mother used to tell us a lot of stories about great saints and missionaries, and there were biographies of St Alphonsa, St Theresa of Child Jesus, St Dominic Savio, St. Francis Xavier, St Francis Assisi, St Maria Goretti, Father Damian etc, in my house for us to read.

Immediately after completing my high school in 1975, I expressed to my parents and then to my parish priest about my desire to become a missionary priest, and joined the Missionary Society of Saint Thomas (MST). I was with them for 8 years: 3 years of minor seminary, 3 years of philosophy, one year each before and after Philosophy in Ujjain mission diocese in the state of Madhya Pradesh. After that, being discouraged to continue with MST by their superiors, I say God's plan, I continued in Ujjain diocese as a teacher in their schools while searching new openings to continue my vocation. That took 4 years meanwhile completed my BA with First Rank and halfway MA.

In 1987, I joined the La Salette Congregation in the Philippine Province. That formation took 8 more years: 4 years of Theology, in between one year of Postulancy, one year of Novitiate, one year of Regency and one year of Diaconate. And I was ordained on February 10, 1995, and that was 20 years after I joined seminary. I recall OT Jacob who, in his 20 years of perseverance in Laban's house, had 2 wives. In my 20 years of seminary life, I started with MST and continued with MS. But God was working for me in these years.

I served 4 years as a priest in the Philippines, then 9 years in India with varied ministries and experiences as Rector for the minor seminarians in Hunsur, then Parish Priest in Neyyattinkara diocese and then in Kannur diocese, and then Vocation Promoter. In 2008, I volunteered to go to Argentina Mission which was a very significant milestone and very challenging decision in my life. But those were the rich and memorable experiences as a religious missionary priest in my life. After 5 years in Argentina, then one year in Andhra Mission, and now I am serving 6 years in California Mission of the La Salette Congregation.

When I was ordained my caption was, "I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Mt 28:20), but today I say, "Draw near to God, and he will draw near to you,"(Jas 4:8) as in the afternoon of my life. MERRY CHRISTMAS
