
NOVENA TO OUR LADY OF LA SALETTE NOVEMBER 2020

1st Day

"From the 'Valley of Tears' to the heights of 'Tears and Light'

Guidepost for Reflecting

- "Why do you look for your children, Mary, in this place, so high and so inaccessible? Where do you come from? Have you been "sent" (Jn. 8/42) like your Son?"
- "Mary, why are you bent over in tears over the cold tomb of our sinful lives like a Mary of Magdala?"
- "How can you see us from this place, so high and so removed?"

In the Apparition

"I believed, said Maximin, that it was a mother from nearby village, who had been beaten by her children and then ran to the mountain, to cry in solitude."

In Scripture

- a) Mark. 1/37—38:
- "...when they found Him they said: 'Everyone is looking for You.' Jesus said, 'Let us go elsewhere, to the neighboring country towns, so that I can proclaim the message there, too, because that is why I came."
- b) John. 6/15:
- "Jesus, as He realized they were about to take Him by force and make mm king, fled back to the hills, alone."
- c) The readings of the Transfiguration and the Agony in the Garden of Olives.

Question for Reflection...

What does ... to be 'sent' like Jesus and Mary ... mean to us?

Irresistible Image of a Mountain. Mountains attract us.

Guideposts for Reflecting

A mountain urges us 'to climb to the sky, it even defies to be conquered. But what is real success? Is it not the conquest of oneself.

Pride in overcoming one's limitations (There are other various (Mountains) in the lives of men.") or quests for encounters where one feels appreciated?

In the Apparition

"Come near, my children, do no! be afraid..."

In Scripture

- a) Elijah on the way to encounter the Lord: 1 Kings 19/1-14.
- b) "I lift my eyes to the mountains: where is my help to come from?" (Ps. 121/ 1-2)
- c) "For no prophecy ever came from human initiative. When people spoke for God, it was the Holy Spirit that moved them." (2 Peter 1/21)

Question for Reflection...

- Mary had 'descended' and invites us 'to climb upward' She says that the place to meet her crucified Son is in the "God who has united heaven and earth!" ... Can this tell us something about the way we should live our La Salette vocation?

3rd Day

Mountain Paths

Guideposts for Reflecting

- Paths had been cleared by others once ... they had a reason for existing, often for very practical reasons (trails were necessary for a well-balanced rural but fragile economy).

Our era of conformity praises being 'off the beaten path' and skiing 'off the main trail' (even if it endangers the lives of others)....

Pilgrims can walk on mountain paths with naked feet, despite pebbles and thistles....

In the Apparition

- The "path" of the Virgin. a path of the cross, tears and light...
- -The "Path around Mt. Planeu" at La Salette.- one walks in a circle but there is always something new to see or encounter.

In Scripture

You smooth the path of upright. Your Name, Your Memory are all our soul desires" Isaiah 26/7-8).

He can be called "One Who Clears the Way"

All the themes in Scripture concerning 'Paths of the Lord', 'Paths of the Just', 'Paths of the wicked'.

Question for Reflection...

- Are we ready to accept new paths or accept paths already opened? or perhaps both?

7th Day

The Desert Guideposts for Reflecting

- The sandy desert, the human desert...At La Salette, the scenery is easily described as being deserted; it is easy to isolate oneself there

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- But why 'come to the desert', what does one 'do in the desert'? Mary chose to 'come to the desert' to speak to "all her people"

In the Apparition

The mysterious sleep of the children, a prelude to the 'visit'. The discourse of the Beautiful Lady and the discourse of Moses in the name of God in Deuteronomy.

In Scripture

- "I am going to seduce her and lead her to the desert and speak to her heart" ... "there she will respond as when she was young"... (Hosea 2/16-17)
- Mark 1/12: The Spirit led Jesus into the desert to be tempted.

Questions for Reflection

- To make a desert within oneself: a desert of what? and for what? and for Whom?
- How to live during 'desert-times', spiritual or apostolic ... and even the desert of human relationships when old age comes and the aloneness?

8th Day

Flocks in the Mountains

Guideposts for Reflecting

- Images of shepherds with their sheep or cows and sheepdogs.
- Images of herds of cows, flocks of sheep...
- a place for walking in processions ... to the nourishment of the Word of water
- of the Bread of Life.

The Church: the flock of God and the People of God ... and those 'outside' the Church.

In the Apparition

"If my Son is not to abandon you, I am obliged to pray without ceasing..."

In Scripture

Mt. 9/36: "And when He saw the crowds He felt sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd"...

Ezekiel 34.:"My sheep is astray on every mountain and on every high hill; my flock has been scattered all over the world... no one bothers about them and no one looks for them".

John 10/16 "And there other sheep that I have that are not of this fold and I must lead these too."

Questions for Reflection

How does the 'devotion of God for His people-flock' pertain to our "being religious"?

9th Day

Rocks Guideposts for Reflecting

Obstacles on the road, to go around or to scale...pebbles that spoil the walk...Hardness and fragility being found at the same time. (Pebbles and rocks can cause someone to trip and fall...)

The difference between the mountainous rock formations (vertical, compact and broken or massif and isolated like Mt. Obiou) and the gentle slope of the prairies ... Everything is not accessible...

In the Apparition

"If they are converted, the stones and rocks will become heaps of wheat"

In Scripture

- a) "I will remove your heart of rock and I will give you a heart of flesh".
- b) The parable of the house built on sand or rock...
- c) "Blessed is the Lord, my Rock" (cf. Psalm 17).

Thought for Reflection

- What are real rocks of our lives? and those that block the view?
- Is Christ, the Rock and Corner-stone of our life...

7th Day

Crystal

Guideposts for Reflection

- The fascination of everything that shines, the strange...
- -To release crystals from a rock or from the veil within the motherlode requires work, care, attention, patience, at times suffering and even failure or brokenness .
- To be purified 'as gold in a crucible'...

In the Apparition

We cross and the gleaming tears of the beautiful Lady ... roses and tears. "I would have really wanted to have one" said the child after the Apparition.

In Scripture

- "Where your treasure is, there also will be found your heart." "What does it profit a man to win the universe if he loses his very self"
- "I consider everything as of little importance when compared with the supreme advantage of knowing Christ, my Lord. What I once considered my assets, I look as losses, if only I can gain Christ and be given a place with Him" Phil. 3/12).

Questions for Reflection

- Are we not the treasure, purchased at a great price? "Not one of us lives, nor dies, for oneself or alone."
- What have we ever given or consecrated that we had not received?

8th day

Scaling the Mountain Alone ... or Being Roped Together

Guidepost for Reflecting

- an image of togetherness.but also of a certain aloneness...

The Community, a collection of solitary people?

(I have not chosen my companions that I am tied to Another has chosen themWhat hard work it is to tie myself to others ... and so to live!)

At the Apparition

"You haveprayed well, donewell, but youcannevermakeup for the agony I have undertaken for you..."

In Scripture

"If you do not hold on to me, you hold on to nothing." "Lord, you will grant us peace, having completed all our undertakings for us." Isaiah 26/12).

Questions for Reflection

Re-read Numbers 15 to 20 of the "Foundations" in our 'Rule of Life' (pages 43-44).

- How do we give of ourselves to 'join together' - personally and as a community?

To Contemplate from Above ... and then Come Down

Guideposts for Reflecting

- To see the villages, the cities, the fields of human activity from above, ... all the while knowing that it is necessary to return ...
- To gain a perspective from a 'distance', 'from on high', 'in the desert'...
- then, alone or with others, to release the 'pearls of Life' ...
- and to return below in order to share them ...
- All the while there are above us the birds that soar ... and the uninvolved stars ...

In the Apparition

"Go, my children, make this known to all my people."

In Scripture

- a) "Lord, let us place three tents here ..." (Transfiguration ...).
- b) "I have not told the people of Jacob, "Look for me in chaos!" (Isaiah 45/19).
- c) Mark 5/18-20: the end of the episode with the possessed man of Gerasenes.

Question for Reflection

Cannot an ordinary life become, mysteriously, a 'Mission to find other Worlds' by breaking free from its own world, that may be small and all too self-centered?
